## CINQUE GALLERY. 1969 – 2004

Founders: Romare Bearden (1911-1988), Ernest Crichlow (1914 – 2005), Norman Lewis (1909-1979)

During its four decades of continuous operations the non-profit organization presented widely diverse exhibitions and programs dedicated to supporting and fostering recognition of hundreds of Black and other artists of color:

"....to provide an essential encouragement so vital to the development of serious young [and mature] artists who have already demonstrated ability and a concern for universal aesthetic criteria. The Directors knew that many dealers and museum curators were unwilling to 'gamble' on the artistic maturation of young, unknown artists. This was especially true for minority painters and sculptors...who could not be expected to fulfill their potential unless they were encouraged in a positive way." Cinque Gallery, 1977 Report.
