Job Title: ART INSTRUCTOR - PRINTMAKING

POSITION SUMMARY:

The Art Students League of New York ("The League") has a unique opening for an art instructor to teach a Printmaking class beginning June 2022 . The class meets five days per week for 3 1/2 hours, and the instructor is required to be present two days per week. A studio monitor or Teaching Assistant helps run the class the other three days.

JOB QUALIFICATIONS

- An MFA is suggested but not required.
- 5-10 years of teaching experience at a recognized university or professional art school is required. NOTE: This position is not intended for recent graduates.
- Extensive knowledge of etching techniques (dry point, aquatint, mezzotint, linocut) and lithography (stone and aluminum plates) is required.
- Qualified candidates should have a substantial record of gallery or museum exhibition.
- An ability to work with students of all backgrounds and skill levels.

Interested candidates should e-mail (in PDF format) a letter of interest, teaching philosophy, artist statement, and artist's CV. Please also include a link to an online portfolio or website where creative work (15-20 samples) can be viewed. Include specs, media, and date of the work.
