OBTAINING THE FORM I-20

Certificate of Eligibility for F-1 Student Status

The information on the following pages explains how to obtain the Form I-20. Please read and follow the directions <u>completely</u> to avoid delays in getting your I-20.

NOW THAT YOU ARE PLANNING TO BE A STUDENT OF THE LEAGUE'S CERTIFICATE PROGRAM, THERE ARE TWO THINGS YOU MUST NOT DO!

1. DO NOT ENTER THE U.S. WITH A B-1, B-2, OR B-1/2 VISA

If you use a B visa to enter the U.S. you are saying "I'm here as a visitor" *only*. Since you contacted our school about study in the League's Certificate Program, this could be viewed as misrepresenting your purpose for entering the U.S. and you might be refused permission to extend or to change your status. Do <u>not</u> listen to people who say it is easy to enter the country as a visitor and change your status to F-1 Student. This is not true! U.S. federal regulations prohibit B Visitors from pursuing a course of study prior to obtaining a change of status to F-1 Student.

If your study plans are not certain and you want to enter the U.S. to visit schools, you must explain this on your visa application and ask the visa officer for a B-2 visa with the words "Prospective student" noted on the visa, or have the words added to your B visa if you already have one.

2. DO NOT ENTER THE U.S. ON THE VISA WAIVER PROGRAM (Tourist or Business)

If you are from a country from which you can enter the U.S. as a visitor by registering for ESTA, do not do this. You will be permitted to stay for only 90 days. You will not be given more time or allowed to change to F-1 Student status.

WHAT IS A FORM I-20 AND WHY DO YOU NEED ONE?

The I-20 is a government form that certifies your eligibility for F-1 student status. That means that (1) you are or expect to be a "bona fide" student; (2) you meet our admissions requirements; (3) you will pursue a full course of study; (4) you proved to us that you have the finances to study and live in the U.S. without working illegally or suffering economic hardship. You need the Form I-20 to obtain an F-1 Student visa and nonimmigrant student status, or to remain in lawful F-1 status when transferring or changing schools within the U.S.

DOES EVERYBODY NEED A FORM I-20?

NO, some international students do not need the I-20. B Visitors, F-2 dependents, and other status categories, must obtain an I-20 to apply for a change of status to F-1 to pursue a full-time course of study that is not avocational or recreational in nature. If you are maintaining another nonimmigrant status in the U.S., you do not have to have an I-20 and may attend school full- or part-time. Dependent children in E, H, I, J, L, M, N, O, P, R, or S status need to change status after their 21st birthday or if they marry.

RULES FOR OBTAINING YOUR FORM I-20

- 1. YOU MUST BE A "BONA FIDE" STUDENT, ACCEPTED TO ONE OF THE FULL-TIME FOUR-YEAR CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS OFFERED AT THE ART STUDENTS LEAGUE: FINE ARTS PAINTING, FINE ARTS PRINTMAKING, OR FINE ARTS SCULPTURE.
- 2. YOU MUST <u>PROVE</u> THAT YOU CAN SUPPORT THE COSTS OF LIVING AND STUDYING IN THE U.S. FOR <u>EVERY YEAR</u> OF YOUR CERTIFICATE PROGRAM WITH THE ART STUDENTS LEAGUE. THIS IS REQUIRED BY THE U.S. GOVERNMENT IN ORDER TO ISSUE THE FORM I-20.
- 3. DO NOT EXPECT THAT YOU WILL BE ABLE TO WORK IN THE U.S. TO HELP MEET YOUR ANNUAL COSTS. On-campus employment is very limited; off-campus employment is strictly controlled by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security.
- 4. CAREFULLY REVIEW OUR SCHOOL'S "ESTIMATED ANNUAL COSTS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS" ON PAGE 5 TO CALCULATE YOUR "ESTIMATED ANNUAL COSTS" IN THE WORKBOX ON PAGE 6. THIS IS THE AMOUNT THAT YOU MUST SHOW PROOF OF FOR SUPPORT OF EVERY YEAR IN YOUR PROGRAM OF STUDY. (Estimate that it will take four years for a certificate of completion in Fine Arts Painting, Printmaking, or Sculpture.)
- 5. THESE REQUIREMENTS ARE NOT NEGOTIABLE. The financial requirement represents a modest average budget that does not include luxuries of any kind. We strongly recommend that you budget at least 10% more if possible. Too little money may cause hardship and distress. Students and their families should look closely at the costs of living in New York City and studying at The Art Students League in the Certificate Program and make careful plans to ensure your needs will be met.
- **6. EXPECT ANNUAL INCREASES** in tuition and living costs of approximately 10%.
- 7. WE MAY HAVE TO ASK YOU TO GIVE US MORE PROOF OF YOUR FUNDING perhaps more than once. The U.S. government requires that we be sure, to the best of our ability, that you will have enough financial support during your studies.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR OBTAINING YOUR FORM I-20

- 1. COMPLETE THE *I-20 APPLICATION*, INCLUDING ALL REQUIRED FINANCIAL INFORMATION (SEE BELOW).
- 2. IF APPLICABLE, HAVE YOUR SPONSOR(S) COMPLETE THE SPONSOR'S AFFIDAVIT AND ATTACH THE REQUIRED EVIDENCE.
- 3. SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION, EVIDENCE, AND SPONSOR'S AFFIDAVIT VIA EMAIL TO tom@artstudentsleague.org. DO NOT SEND ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS. KEEP THE ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS FOR YOUR VISA INTERVIEW.
- 4. IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMEND THAT YOU SUBMIT YOUR I-20 APPLICATION, EVIDENCE, AND SPONSOR'S AFFIDAVIT AT THE SAME TIME AS YOU ARE APPLYING TO THE LEAGUE'S CERTIFICATE PROGRAM.

FUNDING SOURCES

YOUR FUNDING CAN COME FROM ANY COMBINATION OF SOURCES IN THE U.S. OR ABROAD:

1. <u>FUNDS FROM "SPONSORS"</u> (parents, relatives, friends, organizations). You may have as many sponsors as you need. Sponsors may provide you with support in the form of money and/or room and board. Free room and board means being offered lodging and not having to pay rent or for food.

IMPORTANT

- It is highly recommended that at least part of your financial support come from your home country. This helps when applying for your student visa!
- A sponsor should promise only as much money as he or she is <u>capable</u> of giving you. Some sponsors believe that the more money they promise the easier it will be to get your I-20. THE MOST COMMON REASON WE REJECT FINANCIAL DOCUMENTS IS THAT WE DO NOT BELIEVE THE SPONSOR CAN AFFORD TO GIVE AS MUCH MONEY AS PROMISED. A sponsor should promise only what he or she intends to give and only as much as can be afforded.
- 2. <u>PERSONAL FUNDS</u> come from <u>your own</u> resources, not those of anyone else. If your parents put money in your bank account, we will ask you to submit the evidence required of sponsors. Unless you have enough cash to support yourself for your entire program of study or can prove other sources of personal income, you will need a sponsor with an income sufficient to support you.
- <u>FUNDS FROM THIS SCHOOL</u> Not all Art Students League support covers the entire program
 of study or all expenses, so you will need additional support to meet your minimum annual
 costs.

EVIDENCE REQUIREMENTS

COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FOR THE FORM I-20 (attached) AND SUBMIT IT WITH ALL THE REQUIRED EVIDENCE OF FUNDING DIRECTLY TO THE INTERNATIONAL STUDENT SERVICES OFFICE VIA EMAIL TO tom@artstudentsleague.org (DO NOT MAIL ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS; KEEP THEM FOR YOUR VISA INTERVIEW).

ALL DOCUMENTS YOU PROVIDE MUST BE:

- Not older than two months
- In English. (We cannot review documents that are not translated into English)

EVIDENCE REQUIRED:

A. SPONSORS OF CASH SUPPORT:

1. SPONSOR'S AFFIDAVIT AND EVIDENCE OF ANNUAL CASH SUPPORT. This form may be copied for each sponsor. <u>All</u> questions must be answered.

2. PROOF OF INCOME.

Individual Sponsor:

- Income tax returns or receipts
- Pay stubs for last six months
- Bank/investment statements for the last six months

Company Sponsor:

- Business registration
- Licenses
- Profit and loss statement
- 3. **BANK STATEMENT in the name of the sponsor** *only*. A monthly <u>statement</u>, not older than two months, of balances and deposits. Letters from bank officials will not be accepted in lieu of statements.

IMPORTANT

- If there is no proof of income provided with a bank statement, the statement balance will be totaled and divided by the number of years in your program of study to determine the amount available to you for each year.
- The income of a company is not the personal income of the owner of the business
 and will not be accepted as proof of income. The owner/sponsor must still provide
 proof of personal income.
- If a bank statement is in the name of more than one person, each individual must submit an affidavit of support.
- We cannot accept bank statements that do not specify monthly balances and deposits!

IMPORTANT

If you are presently in the U.S., you must be living with the sponsor at the time of filing this application for this to be counted towards your means of support.

WHAT DOES THIS AFFIDAVIT MEAN?

- Fill this form out in English (or have it officially translated). <u>Promise only the amount of money you are able to give</u>. The most common reason we reject affidavits is that we do not believe a sponsor can afford to give as much as promised.
- Sign and date the affidavit.
- Attach the supporting evidence listed below. The affidavit will not be accepted without the required supporting evidence.
- Give the student the original documents and have him or her submit them electronically or make photocopies to mail or fax to us with the application for a Form I-20. The student will need to keep the originals to present to the consul at the visa interview.
